FOR SIZE.

The 1984 Voyager's trim new size is the result of Chrysler Corporation's computer-assisted design technology. The best features of vans and station wagons have been combined. Voyager's reduced exterior dimensions (overall height is 64.2 inches) allow it to fit into any normal size garage, parking structure, parking space or car wash—as easily as any conventional station wagon.

FOR RIDE AND HANDLING.

Chrysler Corporation's leadership in front-wheel drive technology gives Voyager many advantages over reardrive vehicles: better traction on wet and slippery surfaces, good directional stability, and size and weight efficiencies. Power rack-and-pinion steering delivers a positive "feel for the road."

A new dual-path Iso-Strut front suspension and leaf spring rear suspension help isolate road shock and contribute to a smooth ride. And



the road-gripping performance of all-season steel-belted radial tires combines with power dual-system hydraulic brakes that feature a load-sensing proportioning valve for smooth, even stops.

FOR CARRYING PEOPLE.

Voyager's "human engineered" interior is remarkably spacious. Front-wheel drive design and a transverse (sideways) mounted engine create a bigger passenger area without increasing the vehicle's length. The old rear-drive transmission "hump" is reduced for increased leg room, while a low, flat floor adds more interior head room.

Voyager's versatile removable rear bench seat lets you change the interior to meet your needs, and you can add an optional Seven-Passenger Seating Package (available on Voyager SE and Voyager LE only) to carry a crowd. Voyager gives you up to 125 cubic feet of cargo space with rear bench seats removed.

FOR QUALITY.

There's a quality difference you can see, hear and feel in the 1984 Plymouth Voyager. Designed through extensive use of advanced CAD/CAM (computer aided design/computer assisted manufacturing) technology, Voyager is the product of Chrysler Corporation's \$365,000,000 assembly


plant in Windsor, Ontario, one of the most advanced in the world. The goal is a high level of fit and finish for the new Voyager.

FOR 5/50 PROTECTION.

Proof of Chrysler's belief in the quality of its vehicles is Chrysler Corporation's Five-Year/50,000-Mile Protection Plan. Upon expiration of the normal 12month/12,000-mile new vehicle limited warranty, limited warranty coverage is extended on power train components—including engine, transmission/transaxle, and axle—to five years/50,000 miles, whichever comes first. This 5/50 coverage also includes outer panel rust-through protection. A deductible applies. Fleet and lease vehicles are excluded. See your dealer for details. The 5/50 Plymouths. 
